

AUBMC Receives its 5th Joint Commission International (JCI) Reaccreditation

Beirut, February 4, 2021: The American University of Beirut Medical Center (AUBMC) announced its 5th reaccreditation by the Joint Commission International (JCI) on February 2, 2021. This distinction has been achieved without a single unmet measurable element for the first time and is an attestation to AUB's robust commitment to resist and persist despite all challenges.

The Joint Commission International (JCI), an independent non-profit organization, is the most established accrediting body in healthcare in the United States. Its accreditations and certifications are recognized as a global leader for healthcare quality of care and patient safety. This year's JCI reaccreditation surveys, although remote, have been the most rigorous in assessing compliance with standards of care and safety. According to several JCI surveyors' testimony, the exit report described AUBMC processes as well designed, implemented, sustained, and even inspiring. The JCI site visit team enthusiastically recognized the extent to which all faculty and staff are involved in reinforcing and supporting quality patient care.

Marking this recognition, Dr. Fadlo R. Khuri, President of AUB, said: "We are delighted and proud of receiving the JCI reaccreditation for the 5th time, and I'd like to thank the accreditation team for their incredible effort. This exceptional accomplishment is a rare occurrence, even in far better times than the pandemic and crisis wracked period that we are living through today." He added, "The Medical Center and its teams are the core of the university which was founded 154 years ago. They never quit; they inspire me, the citizens of Lebanon, and the region."

In recognition of the efforts made, Dr. Ghazi Zaatari, Interim Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, said: "This has been a stellar achievement by the dynamic staff and teams of the Medical Center. Our members are not strange to such recognitions; their past record speaks for itself. However, what is different this round was the spectacular vibrant sense of demonstrating, and with great pride, the determination to excel against all odds. Kudos to everyone who made this reaccreditation a yet another shining success to the AUB community."

During the survey exit meeting, the Medical Center Director, Mr. Joseph Otayek, mentioned that even amid the succession of catastrophes that have struck Lebanon including the COVID-19 pandemic, the economic crisis, and the horrific August 4 blast, AUBMC family mustered all its efforts and showed great perseverance and resilience by completing the JCI survey successfully. He stressed on how each person in this institution, from the janitors to the physicians showed a sense of dedication that is absolutely remarkable.

Addressing the AUBMC community, Dr. Pierre Sfeir, Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs and Chief Medical Officer, said: “This year, the survey has a special meaning to us.
